ABOUT COMMUNITY LINKS

This guide is provided by the SAMSHA Mental Health Awareness Training Grant (MHAT). The Concho Valley MHAT project will train and certify individuals as Mental Health First Aiders in the Concho Valley. The project will focus on training the public, service members, veterans and their families (SMVF), first responders, and public and private school personnel identify signs of mental illness and train to make appropriate referrals to license mental health providers and community resources. The curriculum to be used is the evidence-based Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) training.

ABOUT MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID

Mission: IDENTIFY. UNDERSTAND. RESPOND.

Mental Health First Aid is a skills-based training course that teaches you how to identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders. The training gives you the skills you need to reach out and provide initial help and support to someone who may be developing a mental health or substance use problem or experiencing a crisis.

Mental Health First Aiders are.... Teachers, first responders, and veterans. They're neighbors, parents, and friends. They're people in recovery and those supporting a loved one. They're First Ladies and Mayors. Mental Health First Aiders are anyone who wants to make their community healthier, happier, and safer for all!

Most of us would know how to help if we saw someone having a heart attack—we'd start CPR or, at the very least, call 9-1-1. But too few of us would know how to respond if we saw someone having a panic attack or if we were concerned that a friend or co-worker might be showing signs of alcoholism.

Mental Health First Aid takes the fear and hesitation out of starting conversations about mental health and substance use problems by improving understanding and providing an <u>action plan</u> that teaches people to safely and responsibly identify and address a potential mental illness or substance use disorder.

When more people are equipped with the tools they need to start a dialogue, more people can get the help they need. Mental Health First Aiders are a vital link between someone experiencing a mental health or substance use challenge and appropriate support.
